

Wan Chai Development Phase II (WDII) Review



Government's Mission along Hong Kong Island north shore:

- Complete the missing strategic road link and alleviate traffic congestion
- Improve public access to harbour and use of harbour-front by the public

HEC's Recommendation:

- Enhance public participation during the WDII Review
- Conduct Harbour-front Enhancement Review Wan Chai, Causeway Bay and Adjoining Areas (HER) in parallel with WDII Review

Aim of HER:

• To achieve a socially, environmentally and economically sustainable harbour-front in Wan Chai, Causeway Bay and the adjoining areas

The Process

Planning/ Design Specialists: decreasing involvement from Envisioning Stage to Detailed Planning Stage

Envisioning Stage

- Identify development opportunities and constraints at the harbour-front and engage the public to give visions, wishes and concepts on the kind of harbour-front they hope to have
- Formulate with the public a set of sustainability principles and indicators for evaluation of Concept Plans in the next stage

Key Components of Envisioning Stage

- Collaborators
- Information to Public
- Public Engagement Activities
 - 5 Public Forums
 - 2 Community Design Charrettes
 - Opinion Surveys
 - Telephone, Road-side and Self-administered questionnaires
 - Expert Panel Forum
 - Consolidation Forum

Collaborators

Collaborators representing different sectors of the public (District Councils, local/community groups, business groups, green groups, professional groups and academic institutions) :

- reviewing the constraints and opportunities;
- establishing preliminary sustainability principles and indicators;
- promote public participation activities through their social network;
- ensure a fair and transparent process; and
- evaluate concept plans in Realization Stage

Information to Public

- Information uploaded to HEC's website
- Flyer, Public Engagement Kit, advertisement, exhibition panels, etc.



Public Forums & Community Charrettes

Public forums

- to collect views and concerns of the public
- to establish a set of sustainability principles and indicators for evaluation of Concept Plans in Realization Stage

Community Design Charrettes

 to assist participants to envision the future harbour-front



Expert Panel Forum

- A thorough discussion among experts in the relevant field before embarking onto the Realization Stage
- To review and make recommendations on sustainable transport planning and Central-Wan Chai Bypass





Consolidation Forum

- Share with the public ideas and proposals received during Envisioning Stage
- Consolidate ideas and proposals





Outcome of Envisioning Stage

Arrived at consensus on the followings:

- Minimizing the amount of reclamation
- Some land uses along the harbour-front (e.g. water sports, recreational activities at the ex-PWCA basin and maintain existing cultural heritage in the Causeway Typhoon Shelter, etc.)
- CWB to be built in a tunnel rather than at grade or elevated road

Retaining existing CBTS

Or

Limited Reclamation at Corners of CBTS

Developing a Marine Basin at PCWA

> Making use of land formation along WC shoreline for harbourfront enhancement

Extending Victoria Park to the waterfront

Business Sector Participation

Proposals from business sectors

- Swire Properties Ltd.
- Hong Kong Regional Heliport Working Group
- Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre Atrium Extension
- Development at A-King Shipyard site

Realization Stage

- Develop concept plans taking into account views and comments received
- Invite public to make further comments on the concept plans
- Evaluate the concept plans based on the Sustainability Principles and Indicators derived during Envisioning Stage
- Arrive at consensus on development proposal

Detailed Planning Stage

• Prepare draft Outline Zoning Plan based on consensus reached at Realization Stage

Keys for the Process

- Time and resources demanding
- Programme control required
- Better reflects public's aspirations
- Opportunities for thorough understanding of issues
- The HEC Sub-committee acts as "facilitator"
 - time commitment
 - facilitating different views
