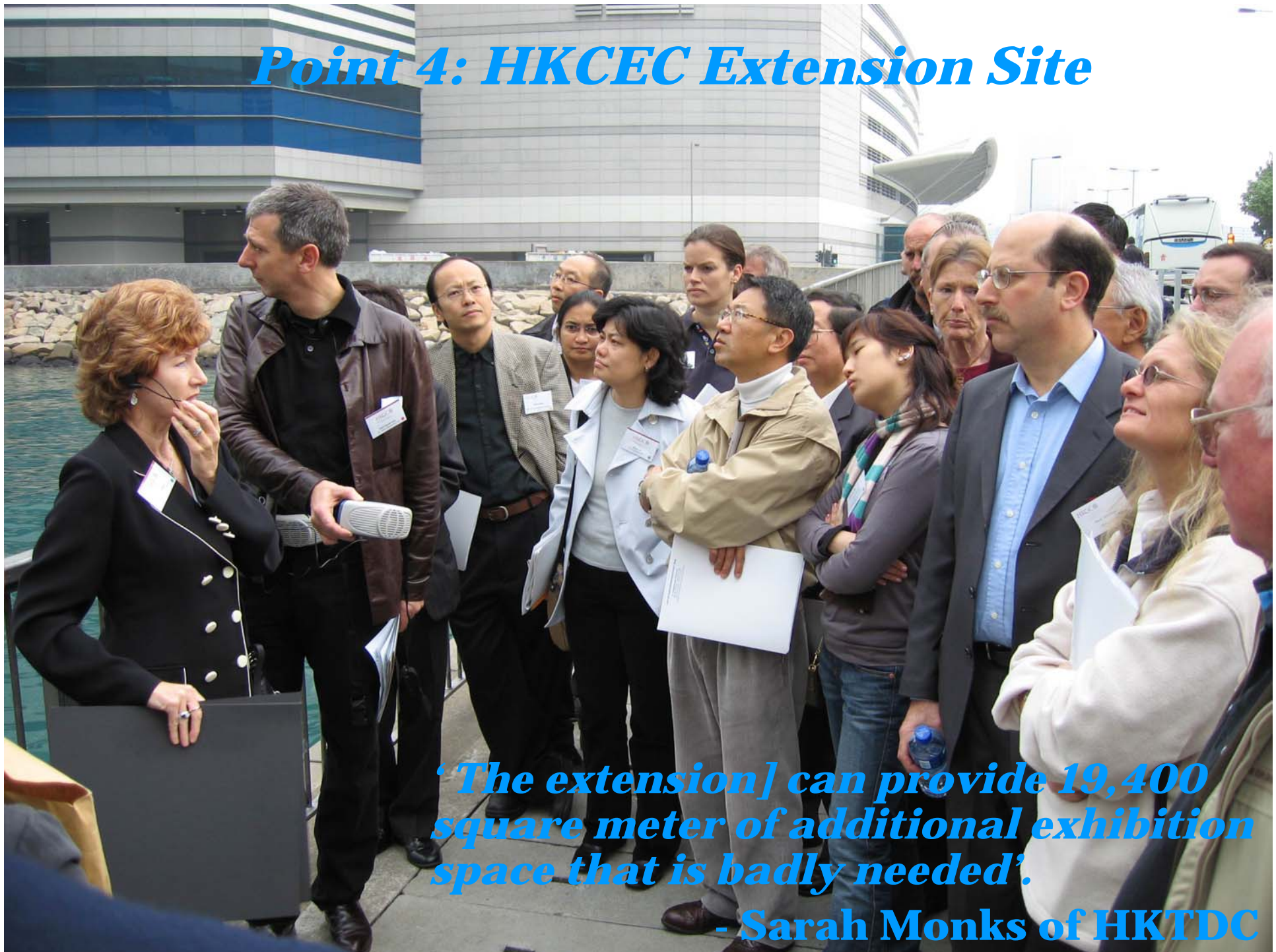


Point 3: Wan Chai PCWA
